



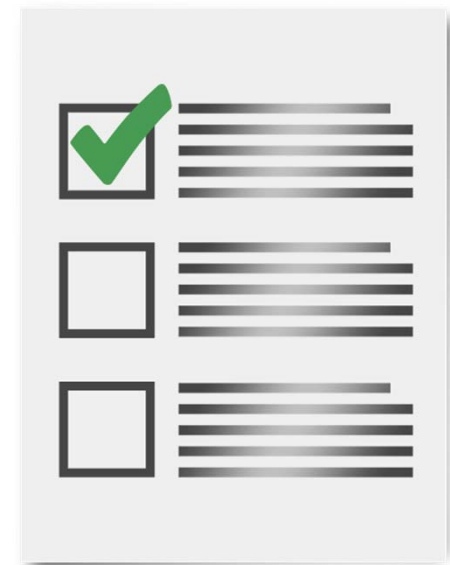
Update on the Joint Health and Social Care Self-Assessment Framework (SAF)
