Background information	
 2007 	The learning disability health self-assessment framework started to be used in England in 2007.
	The self-assessment framework was a very important way for the NHS and councils to work together with people with learning disabilities and families.
2013 	In 2013, the self-assessment framework joined up with the learning disability partnership board reports and became the joint health and social care learning disability self-assessment framework. The joint self-assessment framework was done twice, in 2013 and 2014. People in Clinical Commissioning Groups and councils said they had to do a lot of work to collect information for this.
SAF	We sometimes also call the self-assessment framework, the SAF.

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
